

Bird Hide

The Bird Hide has wheelchair access, and in addition to bird watching can be used for painting and photography. Car parking is available nearby during the week and a short distance away at weekends.

Woodbank Walk

Woodbank walk runs between the car park at Ulverscroft Grange and the Wood yard car park at Ulverscroft Manor. This path is approximately 736 yards long and offers wonderful views across the fields towards Bradgate Park and beyond. Sited along its length are 11 benches, kindly donated by a number of generous groups and individuals.

As the path enters the third field, on route from the Grange towards the Manor, there is a long incline followed by short zigzag slopes. Please take care along this stretch and do not continue if you feel the return journey would be too strenuous.

The walk then crosses Priory Lane and proceeds a short distance along the Manor drive until veering left into Barclay Lane.

Barclay Lane

This short path through the trees links the Manor Drive with the Woodland Walk and has a bench at its half way point on which to sit, relax and enjoy the woodland views.

Woodland Walk

The distance along the Woodland Walk and Barclay Lane leading to Ulverscroft Manor is approximately 340 yards, following a route around a small flight pond. There is plenty of opportunity to sit and enjoy the tranquil surroundings here and parking and toilet facilities (suitable for people with disabilities) are situated in the wood yard car park. From here there is an inclined walk up to the Manor.

We sincerely hope you will make full use of the Foundation's delightful pathways and enjoy the superb scenery they offer.

The Foundation is a registered charity (no: 803525) and it relies upon donations to help maintain the facilities it offers. There is a collection box situated on Woodbank Walk and contributions towards the ongoing work of the Foundation would be gratefully received.

Sensory Garden

Situated at the rear of Ulverscroft Grange on the site of an old swimming pool the Sensory Garden overlooks Bradgate Park, the city of Leicester and beyond. The garden contains a wide selection of sensory plants, a water feature and wind chime and is bordered by a wheelchair friendly paved path. The garden is accessed from the front of the Grange via a decking walk way and there are six benches on which to relax and enjoy the view.

Golf Buggy

The Foundation's electric Golf buggy was purchased as a result of a donation from the Bruce Wake Charitable Trust and a number of fund raising events. This vehicle is used during the week by volunteer drivers to take our less mobile visitors along the pathways.

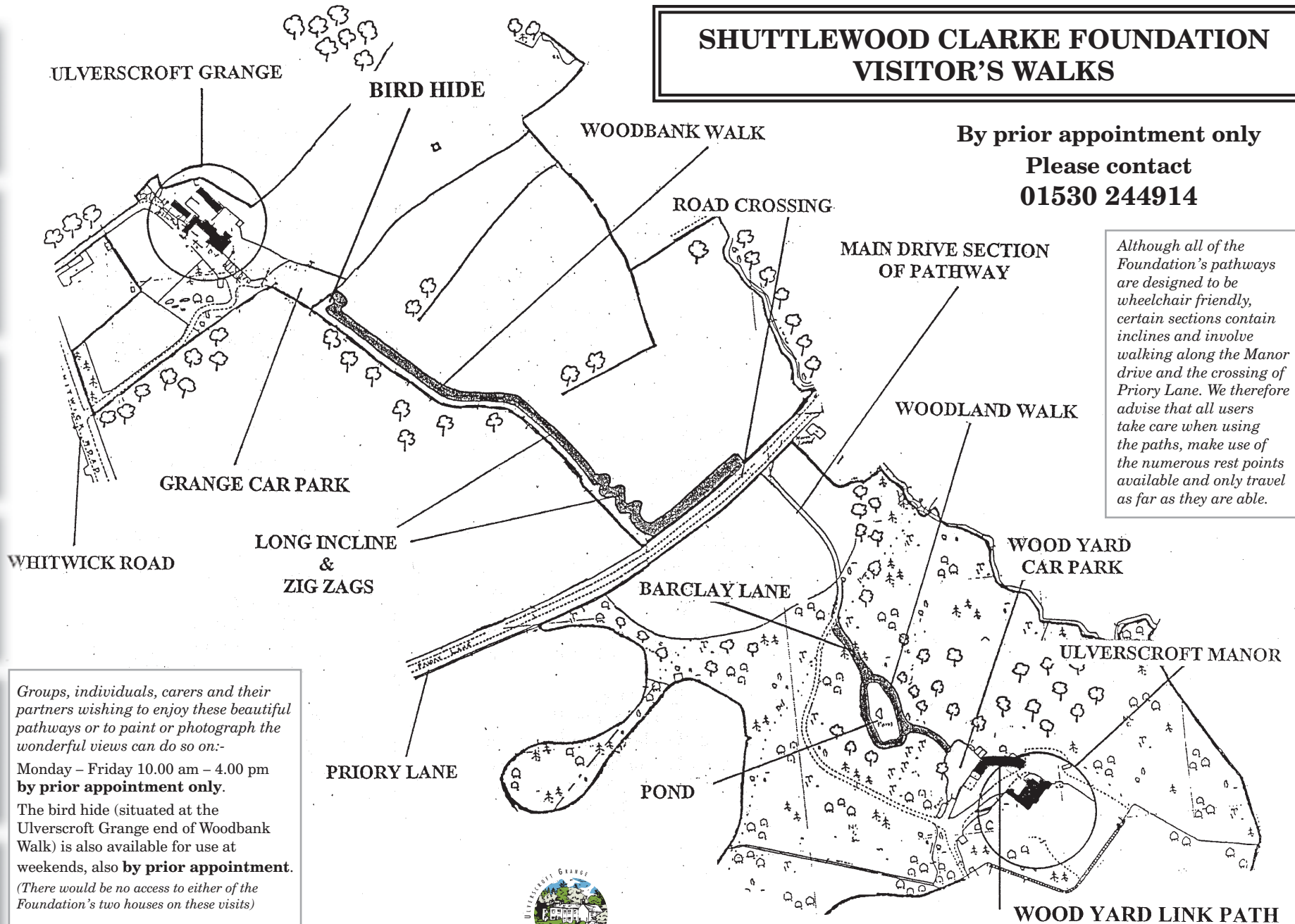


VISITOR WALKS
