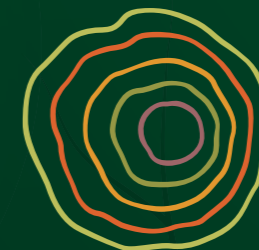

We are delighted to welcome pre-booked groups of elderly, disabled or socially isolated visitors for a full day at the Manor where they can enjoy an uplifting day out in the countryside, a delicious two course, home-cooked lunch, and an all-round home from home. Visitors are free to enjoy the gardens, walks and facilities on offer. The Foundation requests a suggested donation from each visitor to help cover the costs of their day. On occasions where transport is provided by the Foundation an additional donation is also requested.

### How can we arrange a visit?

The Foundation's telephone booking diary opens in early January each year and dates Monday – Wednesday are allocated on a first come basis. The Manor can cater for up to 24 visitors. The Foundation's staff and volunteers are not trained carers and it is the responsibility of the organiser of the visiting group to ensure that they bring sufficient carers and a nominated first aider with them.
